Nova Collectanea Africana – an edited book series on “Minorities in Africa” promoted by the Centro di Studi Africani in Sardegna (CSAS) – is launching a call for chapters for its 2016 issue. This issue will focus on the theme: Mobility and Minorities in Africa.

The notion of ‘minority’ has to be interpreted broadly in order to cover ethnic, religious, linguistic, sexual, national, geographical, social, cultural, economic and political minorities – in Northern and Sub Saharan Africa.

Given the wide range of different kinds of mobility, special attention will be given to specific topics:

- Internal and international mobility;
- Refugees and internally displaced people;
- Mobility and climate change;
- Mobility and development;
- Labour mobility;
- Tourism-related mobility.

Contributions can be in English or French.

SUBMISSION PROCEDURE

Proposals should consist of a preliminary title, an abstract (max 500 words) and a short biographical note. Proposals will be accepted until **15 July 2015** and should be sent to Michele Carboni (michele.carboni@crenos.unica.it). Authors will be notified by **August 1st, 2015** about the status of their proposals.

Full chapters are expected to be submitted by **December 1st, 2015**. Chapters (in **English** or **French**) should not exceed 8000 words. The book is planned to be published in mid-2016. Nova Collectanea Africana is a refereed series and acceptance of full-length articles for publication is subject to anonymous peer-review.
